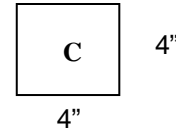
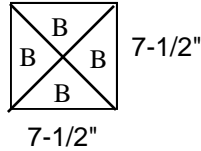
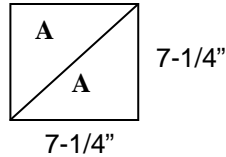

Brown floral 2663-0171	5/8 yd each	16 (B)
Brown paisley 2664-0171		26 (C)

Three Blue/Green Prints	7/8 yd each	From each of the blue/green prints, cut:
Aqua floral 2671-0150		16 (A)
Green leaves 2667-0171		10 (C)
Green paisley 2670-0150		
Brown Dot 2675-0171	1-3/8 yd yards	16 (B) 26 (C) 8 (2 1/4" x WOF) strips for French double fold binding
Lt. Blue Paisley 2670-0171	1-1/3 yds	16 (A) 8 (C) 7 (2-1/2" x WOF) strips, pieced end to end and recut to make 2 (2-1/2" x 55") borders and 2 (2-1/2" x 63-5/8") borders
Light Blue Dot 2666-0171	1-1/3 yards	16 (A) 10 (C) 7 (2-1/2" x WOF) strips, pieced end to end and recut to make 2 (2-1/2" x 59") borders and 2 (2-1/2" x 67-5/8") borders.
Multi Stripe 2662-0171	2-1/4 yds	8 (6-3/4" x WOF) strips, pieced end to end and recut to make 2 (6-3/4" x 71-5/8") side borders and 2 (6-3/4" x 59") top and bottom borders
Backing	your favorite <i>Color Defined</i> fabric	5-1/2 yards
Batting		2 (91" x WOF) panels

Instructions

Note: There are five different two fabric block combinations in this quilt. Before you begin sewing, decide which brown and blue/green fabrics to pair up for the blocks. You will make a total of four blocks from each fabric set, for a total of 20 blocks.

1. On the wrong side of the brown print (C) squares, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Place a brown print (C) square right sides together on a blue/green (A) triangle as shown in Diagram I. Stitch on the drawn line. Flip the brown print fabric so the right side is facing up. Press. Cut away excess fabric if desired. Make a total of 16 pieced triangles from each of the five brown and blue/green fabric sets.
2. Place a blue/green print (C) on top of a brown print (C) patch, right sides together. Draw a line diagonally from corner to corner. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of the drawn line. Cut in half; press toward the brown fabric.
3. Arrange four half-square triangles into a pinwheel as shown in the Block Piecing Diagram. Sew together in rows, then sew together the rows. Add brown (B) triangles to pieced center, pressing seams toward outer edge of block. Add the pieced triangles created in step one, last. Make a total of 20 blocks.
4. Lay out the blocks in five rows of four blocks each. Sew together the blocks into rows, then sew together the rows.
5. Sew the 63-5/8" long light blue paisley border to the sides of the quilt. Sew the 55" long borders to the top and bottom. Press all seams toward outer edge of quilt.
6. Sew the 67-5/8" long light blue dot borders to the sides of the quilt and the 59" long borders to the top and bottom. Press seams toward outside edges.
7. Sew the 71-5/8" long stripe borders to the sides of the quilt. With the remaining half square triangles, make four pinwheel blocks for the outer border corners. Sew a pinwheel block to each end of the 59" long stripe borders. Add borders to the top and bottom of the quilt.
8. Layer top, batting, and backing. Quilt as desired. Bind with the brown dot fabric binding strips.

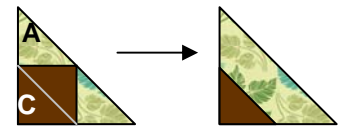
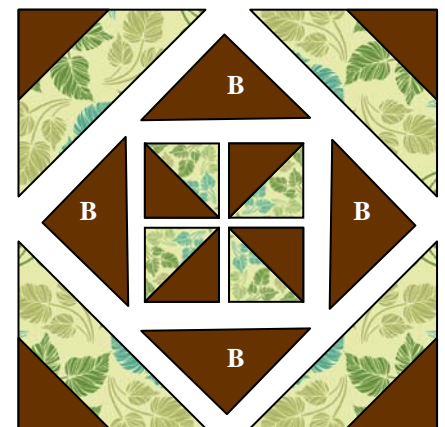
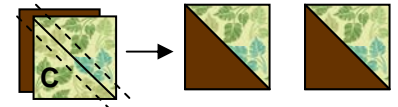


Diagram I
